Position Overview

The Consultant is responsible for developing and implementing the publication plan by providing an outline, full report and key messages / recommendations for public reporting. The Public Report Writer reports to the Director of Programs and works closely with the Intelligence Development Unit and other departments in the Wildlife Justice Commission such as External Relations and Communications.

Tasks and Responsibilities

- Develop and implement a publication plan by defining the outline of the publication, write the report and prepare an overview of key findings and recommendations.
- Produce timely, compelling, informative reports of high value for law enforcement and policy makers.
- Work in close cooperation with the Director of Programs and the Executive Director in developing and implementing the strategy for the publication.
- Work in coordination with the External Relations team and other relevant teams such as investigations & intelligence, communications, and strategic partnerships.

Demonstratable Requirements

Knowledge and Skills

- Understanding of and experience in the area of wildlife crime analysis and / or law enforcement from an analytical perspective.
- Experience as a lead writer on large publications and the ability to turn large publications in accessible products for different stakeholder groups and audiences.
- Knowledge of, and experience in applying, qualitative and quantitative research methods, including a track record of conducting various types of assessments at the international level
